

Setting: Summer, mid-1970's, after all 50 states passed legislation allowing women to serve on federal juries. A jury room in a New York courthouse.

There will be a 15-minute intermission during the performance. Please turn off your cell phones and other electronic devices. Photography and video recording of any kind are not permitted.

Content Disclosure: This play has been rated PG-13 with recommended ages of 13+ for discussion of murder, racist language, and threats of violence. Viewer discretion is advised.



A Letter from the Director

This production is based on the classic movie, *12 Angry Men*, which premiered first as a teleplay and then as a film in 1957 and 1997. The script was released for amateur performance in the early 1960s. The all-male version has played on countless stages across the US and Canada.

Recently, however, the publisher has granted permission to cast both men and women, and to use the title *Twelve Angry Jurors*. Set in a New York jury room on a hot summer day, twelve individuals with various personalities and backgrounds must decide the fate of a 19-year-old man accused of stabbing his father.

The historic presentation of an all-male, all-white jury and an African American dependant certainly lends itself to tense and dramatic conclusions. The addition of women provides an additional and exciting challenge. This cast meets that challenge with sensitivity and insight. It is one of those rare combinations of talents that tells this story the way it was meant to be told. I feel very lucky to have worked with them.

We have also chosen to set our production in the 1970s. By 1958, most states could allow women to legally serve on a jury. However, discriminatory practices were widespread. It was not until 1975 that the US Supreme Court declared that jury selection could no longer discriminate on the basis of sex.

I hope you enjoy our interpretation of this classic. I am grateful for the amazing production team; Karen George, who has always kept me on track, as well as Sam Vanderveen and Laurel Conrad who have served double duty.


Robb Lamer (FOREMAN)
